Melodee has been a volunteer after discovering Agape Table nine years ago when she started coming to use the food bank. She receives the Rewarding Volunteer Benefit from social assistance which was a good motivator to continue volunteering throughout the years.

Melodee is open about her addiction to alcohol and her recovery. She talks about the need for structure in her life and how it helps her overcome her afflictions. She suffered from depression and anxiety and felt useless, until she came to Agape. Socializing and being responsible at Agape Table has improved her self worth. By talking to her in passing you wouldn't have known her struggles, because she always seems happy.

Skyler is 24 years old and a volunteer at Agape Table. He is Ojibway Cree.

His younger years had been traumatic, as his mother passed away when he was nine years old. He was adopted at thirteen years old. It was then he started to use drugs and alcohol. He has been to several foster homes and after bouncing through the system he ended up homeless. He decided to go to detox and now lives at a men’s recovery house. Part of the program at the house is to create a more structured life by volunteering with non-profit

organizations, and this is how he became a part of the Agape Table community.

On his path to recovery Skyler has reconnected with his two young daughters and he is optimistic about his future. Agape table has given him work ethics and structure and he plans to use his experience on his resume. Skyler’s dream is to make other people’s dreams come true in the music industry with a studio for young indigenous artists.



Warehouse


